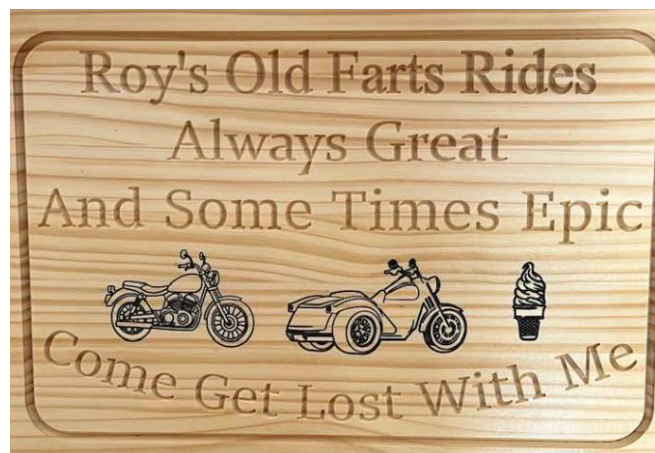
Editor (Jennifer Steffen)

State of Wisconsin Motorcycling and Traffic Safety in 2025



Safety Officer Knickerbocker makes his way to the podium shaking hands as he goes. He is here to give the State of Motorcycling Address to the Wolf River HOG Chapter. He waves to the crowd and then begins his speech. "Mr. Director, Assistant Director, Secretary, Treasurer, Other Officers, Members, Associate Members, Honored Guests, and just plain guests. I stand before you today to share with you the state of motorcycling as it concerns the Wolf River HOG Chapter and beyond.

All in all, and considering the weather, 2025 was a reasonably good year. By good, I mean an active one, yet a reasonably safe one. Though our miles were pretty high, our major rides were basically incident free. There was only one crash fatality in our ranks, and that was not caused by the rider. But, statewide, motorcycle fatalities remain relatively high."

According to a recent report of all traffic fatalities, "The Wisconsin Department of Transportation (WisDOT) indicated a potential for 2025 to end with one of the lowest death tolls in years, with 518 deaths reported by mid-December, below the year average of 584." Of those fatalities, there were 95 motorcyclists killed in crashes last year and 4 passengers. This is slightly less than 2024. (You can mildly applaud that!)

Of those motorcyclists and passengers, approximately 70% were not wearing a helmet. And, it is estimated that at least 35% of motorcycle fatalities involve riders who were impaired by alcohol or drugs. That, my fellow HOG members, is plainly tragic. Additionally, it is estimated that 90% of all motorcycle crashes were caused by the riders' error. Safety Officer, John Knickerbocker states, "This suggests riders involved were not applying strategies that help prevent crashes. Continuous motorcycle training is one way to assist riders in acquiring and maintaining the best riding skills possible. That is why I do what I do. I do my best to educate riders and their passengers in ways to be able to ride safe and still have fun".



John continues, "Though motorcycle fatalities are down compared to previous years, we cannot rest until no one is killed in traffic crashes in Wisconsin. We must continue to drive and ride free, but with concern for the safety of ourselves, and especially our passengers and those with whom we share the road. And yes, there are plenty of other motorists out there that drive stupid. We must be ever vigilant. We must employ every tool in our box at all times to assure each ride is not our last. We must SEE and be SEEN.

We must also follow T-CLOCS to assure our bikes, and likewise our 4-wheel vehicles are as road ready as possible. We must use designated drivers whenever we party. Ladies and gentlemen, I say to you ask not what traffic safety can do for you, but what you can do for traffic safety. Thank you and God Bless the Wolf River HOG Chapter." (You can cheer and applaud now!)

From Kersten: In 2026, despite shrinking margins Docs HD will continue to extend a 15% discount to those members who have attended the monthly meeting or an activity & had their card punched. There is a change however, Docs HD are only going to allow HD rewards to be redeemed on full retail priced merchandise (will have signs at the cash registers). Starting November 1st, they can no longer allow HD rewards to be used as tender on discounted or clearance items. After a close review, they found that most of the rewards dollars are not reimbursed to the dealership by HD corporate as they were originally led to believe by HD corporate when the HD rewards program began. All other aspects of our dealer supported Wolf River Chapter participation incentive discount will remain unchanged. So, no double dipping. Can't take the WRHC discount and then pay with HD Points.
