Chapter Meeting Updates

<u>Director</u> (**Bart Ziewacz**): Bart thanked everyone who helped with the Highway Cleanup and the Halloween Extravaganza. Business Tour Party is Nov. 8. Desserts are needed.

Assistant Director (**Don Brown**): Don shared that the <u>Harley's Let's Ride Challenge</u> has recorded 79,344,493 miles being reported by 29,640 riders. That means Harley will donate \$1 million to charities benefitting veterans and first responders.

The Great Lakes HOG Rally is in Chippewa Falls from 6/11-6/13 and the Harley Homecoming is 7/9-7/12. Harley will be holding a National HOG Rally in Branson, MO on September 9-12. See more details in my article on Page 5.

Secretary (**Bubb Lidke**): Bubb shared that the 2026 Membership Forms are now available. Membership cards will be distributed at the January meeting. Chapter membership is free but you must be a HOG National member. If your HOG National Membership lapses, then your local HOG chapter membership terminates. Doc's will give a 15% discount on full retail priced merchandise to members getting their card punched at a Chapter meeting or an event. You cannot use the discount when redeeming Harley reward points, no double dipping.

Safety



Watch Out for Those Pesky Wabbits, and Deer

Some of you have probably already stored your bikes for the winter. And, that's okay. But, let me guess. You are not likely to go into hibernation for the winter. So, you're going to have to be on Wisconsin roadways, right? Well then, let's take a good, hard, long look at this particular situation. To help us we're going to bring in our old hunting fwiend Elmer Fudge. Did I just talk like him? Anyway, what do you have to share with us, Elmer?



It's nearly my favorite time of year. That's right! Hunting season! You thought there were a lot of deer on our roads already. But now that Mother Nature has them racing around like sex crazed teenagers, it gets even worse. So, we have to be vewy, vewy careful and watch out for deer. There are more deer related crashes in November than any other month. And how do you avoid smacking into one? I'm glad you asked.

- Of course, you know deer are most active at dawn and dusk. So be vewy, vewy careful during these times.
- Drive slower at night to give yourself more time to react if you see a deer. And, you likely remember, if
 you see one deer there may be more.
- Deer-crossing signs are put there for a reason. Watch the sides of the road vewy, vewy carefully
- If you see brake lights on the vehicle ahead of you, it may be the driver saw a deer.
- Headlights confuse deer. Don't try to anticipate which direction they may go. Just slow down
- If the person ahead is driving slowly, the driver may know where to slow down and be vewy, vewy
 careful for deer. And think twice about passing.
- Deer can't get much traction on pavement. So, slow down if you see one. They will not be likely to take
 off fast.
- Dimming your dash lights can make it easier to see deer. If it's dusk or dawn, you can use your visor to block out the lighter sky and be able to see things clearer.
- If there is brush or tall grass near the road, be ready just in case.
- Loud noises scare some deer and confuse others. Remember, echoing can cause a deer to think the sound is coming from someplace else.
- If it looks like you are going to hit a deer, don't swerve, just brake.



If you accidentally injure or kill a deer, try to get it off the road if you can. Report the crash immediately to law enforcement. If you leave a deer in the road, it is not only a hazard to the next car, but may draw scavenger animals making matters even worse. Be alert and you can greatly reduce your chances of hitting a deer, or maybe even a pesky wabbit!

Next, the Scottish Highland cow had a baby that they named Finley. He is building a calf pen for him and mom, Bonnie, to hang out in until he gets a little older.


After working in the zoo, Doc can get back to his other passion of building motorcycles.
